## Improving your roads



### Nottingham City Council is returning to resurface Darley Avenue/Darley Road

In March 2025 Darley Avenue/Darley Road was surfaced using a preventative maintenance treatment called micro surfacing. Soon after this was laid, it became apparent that the quality of the installation was not to the standards that we expect. After investigating this with the specialist contractor who undertook the works it was identified that there had been some material failures.


We have been working with the contractor to resolve this item, and we will be returning with a different contractor to remove the micro surfacing and layer beneath this to provide a new road surface.

Work will begin on 26<sup>th</sup> January until 10<sup>th</sup> February. Hours of work will be 8am to 5pm on weekdays only.

#### How will this affect you?

- Darley Avenue/Darley Road will be closed except for access.
- No parking to take place on the road.
- Vehicle access to driveways will be maintained where possible, although there may be times when this is limited.
- Pedestrian footways will remain in use.
- Bins will be collected on your usual day before 8am.
- If you live on Plantation Side, Meadow Brown Road and Wades Avenue, access throughout the works will be maintained with minor delays. Please note on 3<sup>rd</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> February, access will be severely restricted when installing the new surface course.
