## Nottingham City Council is improving your road

Nottingham City Council is resurfacing Wemyss Gardens & Middleton Boulevard Slip Road.

This will be from Tuesday 21st April until Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> April 2026. Hours of work will be 8am to 5pm and the work will be conducted in two phases, as below:

- **Phase 1** - Tuesday 21st to Friday 24<sup>th</sup> April (Wemyss Gardens)
- **Phase 2** - Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> April (Wemyss Gardens and Southbound Exit Slip Road on Middleton Boulevard)

## How will this affect you in general?

- Footway access will be maintained at all times during the work.
- Your bins will still be collected on your usual day, please ensure these are placed outside your property before 7am.
- During the work, the contractor compound will be located on Wollaton Hall Drive.

**During Phase 1:** We will be undertaking preparation work on Wemyss Gardens. The road will remain open but vehicle access may be restricted on occasions whilst we work near your property.

**During Phase 2:** The Southbound Exit Slip Road on Middleton Boulevard (adjacent to Wemyss Gardens) together with Wemyss Gardens will be closed with a diversion route will be in place. If you live on Wemyss Gardens and need to use your vehicle you will need to park elsewhere. A Residents Parking Permit for Wemyss Gardens allows parking on any street in the Wollaton Hall Drive Permit Scheme, including:

- Baildon Close
- Coombe Close
- Lanark Close
- Oundle Drive
- Wollaton Hall Drive
