Nottingham City Council is planning to improve your road

We are resurfacing the full length of Hendon Rise; work will begin on Mon 22nd June to Fri 10th July 2026.

Please see information below for further details.

Phase 1: Preparation work Mon 22nd June – Fri 3rd July (8am to 5pm)

Hendon Rise will be closed to traffic, however access for residents and deliveries will be maintained, as works to the carriageway will be carried out using localised lane closures.

Phase 2: Resurfacing Mon 6th July – Fri 10th July (8am to 5pm)

Hendon Rise will be closed to traffic whilst resurfacing works are undertaken; during this time, access to residential and business properties may be restricted / limited for periods of time. The Contractor and Traffic management operatives will be on site to help maintain access wherever possible during this phase of the works, to minimise the disruption these works may cause.

How will this affect you during work

- No parking to take place on the road.
- The contractor's compound is to be located at the end of the Hendon Rise cul-de-sac (adjacent to Morley Place)
- Vehicle access to driveways will be maintained where possible, although there may be times when this is limited.
- During the works the existing zebra crossing on The Wells Road (located outside Premier Stores) will be closed during working hours and a temporary pedestrian crossing will be provided during the works.
- Footways will remain in use.
- Bins will be collected on your usual day before 8am.
