Improving your roads

Nottingham City Council is planning to improve your road

We are resurfacing the road on Bramcote Lane, between Renfrew Drive and Wollaton Road. Some areas of the footway will also be resurfaced at the junction with May Avenue, Renfrew Drive and Smythson Drive.

Work will begin on Monday 3rd August, continuing until Thursday 17th September. Please see information below and attached plans for working hours and details of the diversion route for general traffic.

How will this affect you?

All Phases

- All restrictions are in operation during working hours only.
- Footway access will be maintained but at times there will be footway closures in place with a temporary route in place.
- No parking to take place on the road or in the parking bays.
- The road will be closed to general traffic with access maintained for residents and deliveries. There may be short periods when access is limited. The contractor and traffic management operatives will be on site to help maintain access and minimise disruption.
- Driveway access will be provided where possible. There may be short periods when access is limited. The contractor and traffic management operatives will be on site to help maintain access and minimise disruption.
- Residents living on cul-de-sacs off Bramcote Lane (Deer Park, May Avenue, Dovecoat Drive, Smythson Drive) will be subject to restricted turning movements (left turn only or right turn only) during different phases of work.
- Businesses will remain open as usual.
- Buses that use Bramcote Lane will follow a diversion route.
- Your bins will still be collected on your usual day, please ensure these are placed outside your property before 7am.

Phase 1: Preparing for Resurfacing. Monday 3rd to Friday 28th August (8am – 5pm)

- Civils operations will take place prior to the resurfacing. Localised traffic management will be in place along the road and localised footway closures where required.
- Bramcote Lane will be closed to general traffic while this work takes place. Access for residents and deliveries will be maintained where possible.
- Residents living on cul-de-sacs off Bramcote Lane will be subject to restricted turning movements (left turn only or right turn only) as works take place along the road.
- During this phase, Wollaton Road will remain fully open to traffic.

Phase 2: Resurfacing. Tuesday 1st to Thursday 17th September (9:30am – 3:30pm)

- Bramcote Lane will be closed to general traffic while resurfacing takes place. Access for residents and deliveries may be restricted at times during surfacing operations.
- Residents living on cul-de-sacs off Bramcote Lane will be subject to restricted turning movements (left turn only or right turn only) as works take place along the road.
- During this phase, the junction of Renfrew Drive with Bramcote Lane will be closed to traffic, as it will be used as a site compound area.
- This phase will also require closure of a section of Wollaton Road (opposite the Admiral Rodney pub), meaning there will be no through route for traffic between Rectory Gardens and Trowell Road.

Further information on Bramcote Lane:

We are currently not resurfacing from Renfrew Drive to Wollaton Vale roundabout, including the roundabout, due to the following reasons:

- Utility works for gas (Cadent) will resume here in October 2026, to continue the mains replacement works. These works are scheduled to be completed in February 2027.
- Utility works for water (Severn Trent Water) are proposed to be undertaken in the next few years.
- In early September 2026 there will be a full closure of the roundabout to complete the patching that was undertaken recently. This will be late evening for a few hours. Signs will go out on the highway to make you aware of this.
- Nottingham City Council plan to return in early 2028 to complete the road and roundabout. This will enable the above utility works to be completed prior to our highway works.
- In the meantime, we will continue to ensure the whole road and roundabout are maintained to a safe standard.
