Nottingham City Council is planning to improve your road - London Road Gateway Maintenance and Greening Improvements

Highway maintenance funding has been invested into London Road - improving this important Gateway into the city with the whole street approach applied. We have been improving footpaths and undertaken innovative planting in the central reservation and near the end of Victoria Embankment. New bins, benches and tree pit improvements have also been introduced to the length of the road from Victoria Embankment to Ryehill Street.

Phase 2 of the improvements will see further maintenance and greening improvements from Ryehill Street to Crocus Street. These will begin on Monday 13th July until the end of October 2026. Hours of works will be 9.30am to 3.30pm with some weekend working.

Next year we intend to improve the carriageway where required and continue to improve the footway and public realm towards Canal Street/London Road roundabout. This will see the whole gateway into our City improved.

Phase 2 improvements include:

- Footway resurfacing the full length.
- Improve the green area that separates London Road from Meadows Way, to include a new area of planting adjacent to the footway.
- New trees where possible and maintenance to tree pit areas around existing trees, where the footway is damaged or uneven.
- New street furniture including bins and pedestrian safety railings.
- Some restoration work to the historic wall by the green area (pertaining to historic Alms Houses) by reattaching the large coping stones.
- Improve the cycle connection at Ryehill Street, linking the Big Track cycle route along the canal with Meadows Way.

How will this affect you?

Please see plan overleaf for areas of work and proposed dates of working. To note this is subject to change should we encounter any issues on site, sporting fixtures requiring work to pause or adverse weather. In general:

- There will be off-peak lane closures, Monday to Friday from 9.30am to 3.30pm and some weekends.
- Pedestrian diversions will be in place where required.
- Ryehill Street will be closed (expected October 2026). We'll place signs on the highway ahead of this and a signed diversion route will be in place.
- Access to the Fire Station will always be maintained

Information on further phases will be sent out prior to work commencing.
