Nottingham City Council is planning to improve your road

We are resurfacing Nuthall Road, between Llanberis Grove and Cinderhill Island. Once completed this will see the whole of Nuthall Road improved.

For this final phase of works on the road the inbound carriageway area is between Cinderhill Island and the Tesco filling station, and the outbound carriageway area is from Llanberis Grove to Cinderhill Island. The section of Nuthall Road (inbound) between Cinderhill Island and the Tesco filling station, will be resurfaced to tie into the recent emergency resurfacing works undertaken here. Works also include resurfacing the Stockhill Lane and Broxtowe Lane junctions with Nuthall Road.

Work will begin on 14th September, continuing until 15th October. Monday to Friday.

Please see information below and attached plans for further details on the improvements, road closures, and diversion routes.

Civils Work: (14th September to 3rd October; 9:30am – 3:30pm)

Civils operations (kerbing, drainage works etc.) will be undertaken using lane closures. Traffic will still be able to travel into and out of the city on Nuthall Road, using lane 2 only.

- Monday 14th to Tuesday 22nd September – inbound lane 1 closure
- Friday 18th September to Friday 3rd October – outbound lane 1 closure

Resurfacing: (21st September to 15th October; 7:00pm – 6:00am)

Phase 1: (21st to 25th September & 15th October)

- Carriageway resurfacing operations will require closure of the inbound carriageway on the Nuthall Road, during this time a signed diversion route will be in operation.
- Stockhill Lane / Nuthall Road junction will be closed, diversion as shown in yellow on the attached plan.

Phase 2: (28th September to 14th October)

- Carriageway resurfacing operations will require closure of the outbound carriageway on the Nuthall Road, during this time a signed diversion route will be in operation.
- Broxtowe Lane / Nuthall Road junction will be closed, diversion as shown in green on the attached plan.

How will the resurfacing work affect you?

- All restrictions are in operation during working hours only.
- Access will be provided for residents and businesses on Nuthall Road and any cul-de-sacs off Nuthall Road within the closure area. This will be subject to restricted turning movements, depending on the area of resurfacing work in progress. Traffic marshals will be on site to assist with local access.
- There will be no parking, loading, or unloading on Nuthall Road.
- Buses that use Nuthall Road will follow a diversion route during the hours of work.
- Part of the pay & display parking bay on Stockhill Lane near to the park will be used as a material storage area and will therefore not be in use for parking purposes.
- A pedestrian route will always be maintained.
- Bins will be collected on your usual day before 7am.

We will need to return to improve the footways on sections along Nuthall Road. This work will not require a road closure. We will let you know if this work will affect you and update transportnottingham.com with additional information on this nearer the time.
