Nottingham City Council is microsurfacing several roads in the city and will deliver these as a programme of work to reduce disruption to the local community. These roads are:

How will this affect you?

- Each road will be closed between 8am and 5pm and there will be no parking on the road within the work extents, during working hours. Local diversions routes will be in place.
- Vehicle access to driveways will be maintained, although there will be times when this is restricted.
- Pavements will remain in use.
- Roads are swept twice after the microsurfacing takes place. This is usually a day or two after and then around a week after this (we are awaiting a programme for this). The road is relined ASAP (except for stop lines which are reinstated on the day) and any iron work remediations addressed over the next few weeks, also on a rolling programme throughout the city.
- To note, we use a nationwide contractor and sometimes their programme can change, or the weather affects the planned work. If this happens the advanced warning signs that are placed on the highway are changed and the website information is too, so please look out for any changes.
- Bin collections will still take place on your usual collection day; please ensure bins are placed outside your property before 7am.
